HILL SCHOOL SUMMER REQUIRED READING for Rising 4th – 8th Graders – 2014

Grade 3 into 4 A MINIMUM of five books is required. Students take an "Accelerated Reader" test for each of the five books.

Grade 4 into 5 A MINIMUM of eight books is required. Book choices should be of an appropriate level. Students need to turn in a typed list of all books they read over the summer on the first day of school.

Grade 5 into 6 **Required** The One and Only Ivan - Katherine Applegate
Plus One of these: Mrs. Frisby and the Rats of NIMH - Robert O'Brien
Weedflower - Cynthia Kadohata

*Students must select at least **three additional books** of their own choice to complete their summer reading requirement.

Grade 6 into 7 A. **Required for all:** Fever 1793 - Laurie Halse Anderson
B. **Additional books** (750 pages minimum), one of which **MUST** be NONFICTION

Grade 7 into 8 A. **Required for all:** a. The Princess Bride - William Goldman
b. Annie, Between the States - L. M. Elliott
B. **Additional books** (400 pages minimum) **of your own choice**

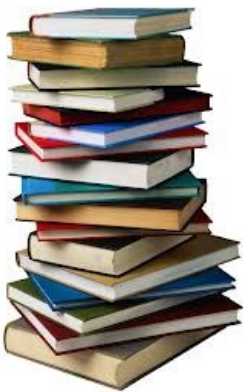
