

## TOWN OF MIDDLEBURG WATER SYSTEM NOTICE

In keeping with the National Primary Drinking Water Regulations, we are obliged to inform you that the Town's waterworks system may be in violation of state regulations. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2015 (April 1-July 31, 2015) we did not monitor or test for radionuclides from two entry points (Well 4 and Wells L&P) and therefore cannot be sure of the presence or absence of radionuclides during that time.

## THERE IS NOTHING YOU NEED TO DO AT THIS TIME. YOU MAY DRINK THE WATER.

Radionuclides were monitored at the two entry points (Well 4 and Wells L&P; Entry points 4 & 5) during September 2015, and results are pending. Historically, radionuclide levels at both entry points have been below the Primary Maximum Contaminant Level established by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency.

We are taking action to prevent further violations by ensuring that all required sampling in our distribution system is done in accordance with the State drinking water regulations. Future violations will be reported as required by State regulations in order to increase consumers' awareness of conditions that exist in their public water system.

Please share this information with all people who drink the water, especially those who will not receive this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, schools and businesses). You can do this by posting the notice in a public building or by distributing copies by hand.
