

CHALLENGE


While NCMEC and the families and law enforcement it supports have seen amazing progress in child safety over the years, there is still more work to do, With more than 460,000 reports of missing children in the United States in a single year and a rise in cases of child sexual exploitation, the need for NCMECs services continues to grow.

SOLUTION

NCMEC offers extensive resources in cases of missing and exploited children that include emotional and reunification assistance for families, the distribution of billions of missing child posters and the work of trained analysts and forensic artists. Drawing on decades of experience to help stop these crimes before they happen and to help people be prepared when they do, NCMEC also provides free education for law enforcement, families and children.
