Dear 3rd Grade Families,

The 3rd Grade Drama class is proud to invite you to the Sheila C. Johnson Center for Performing Arts on Wednesday, May 31st at 6:30 p.m. for a showcase of their drama work! The 3rd grade year in drama is an exciting one filled with new drama terms, techniques, and the creation of original characters, stories, and scenes. It is the first year of formal drama education at Hill School and, as of this moment, the only year the students will have a drama class once a week for the entire school year. The third grade drama curriculum gives students a more in-depth look at the artistic process in preparation for future performances at the Hill School and beyond. This introductory year focuses on how to work as an ensemble (the theatre word for “team”) toward shared artistic goals. Students have, and continue, to work individually and in small groups to create original characters and scenes to be presented during their 3rd Grade Drama Showcase!

Through drama games, exercises, and techniques such as *tableaux*, *pantomime*, *story drama*, and *improvisation*, students have spent the year creating believable characters and imagined worlds while they explored with costumes, props, and set design. We’ve also spent this year improving listening skills and focus, discussing the importance of following directions in theatre, and gaining greater self-confidence through creative expression. The third grade year has also been a time to use drama as a way to improve literacy skills; our drama program exposes students to the elements of dramatic story structure and builds upon their skills for creating meaningful and interesting original narratives. Together, students have used *body*, *voice*, and *imagination* (also known as “their actor’s instruments”) to conceptualize, organize, and refine their original ideas into dramatic work.

On the evening of May 31st we will ask parents to participate in our drama warm-ups and to meet and interview our original characters; we will also ask you to listen to us discuss the skills we’ve learned and why they are important for a performer and finally, to sit back, relax, and enjoy scenes created by the students themselves! **We also invite you to stay for a short reception with light snacks in the theatre lobby after the presentation to celebrate the achievements of our 3rd grade drama students.**
