Each show has a limited number of seats to avoid crowding the theater while still accommodating everyone who wants to see the play. Tickets are available to the Hill School community at this time, and all tickets are free. If you would like to reserve tickets for your family, please follow the directions below. We are asking that each non-8th grade family attend only one performance in order to allow for as many members of the community to see this fantastic show as possible.

Step-by-Step Instructions for Ordering Tickets to Shrek Jr. (on a web browser)

- Click on [this link](#), which will take you to the ticketing homepage that says "Shrek Jr.!"
- If you have not used the OneCause system before (Hill School uses it for auction tickets), a pop up will ask you to provide your name, phone number, and email address in order to set up an account. Complete this form.
- Another pop up will ask if you want to set up a credit card. Decline this (all tickets are free).
- On the left-side menu select the second option down, "Reserve Tickets" (on a phone, use the pull down "Menu" key in the upper left hand corner).
- SELECT TICKETS - Select the number of tickets you need for the day you wish to see the show. At the bottom of the page, select "Next." Note: If you haven't already signed in, you might be asked to at this time.
- ENTER TICKET DETAILS - Directly under the heading that says "Enter Ticket Details" click the underlined link that says "Leave all tickets unassigned". A pop up will ask if you want to Autofill your tickets. Select "Ok, Autofill". All of your tickets will be processed under your name as "Guest of *YOUR NAME*."
- CONFIRM PURCHASE - (note that the Enter Payment step should be skipped automatically). Review your selected date and select "Complete Purchase."
- You will receive a confirmation email. You may print and bring a copy on the day of the show, but a full list of registered ticket holders will be on hand each day.
- On the day of each show, audience members will check in with the name of the person who placed the ticket order (i.e. Guest of _____).
