2022 HILL SCHOOL SUMMER REQUIRED READING

Grade 3 into 4

Read a MINIMUM of five books, each from a different genre. Use your genre wheel to help you make selections. Make a list of the book titles and authors. Write a book recommendation about at least one of the books. Bring the list and the book recommendation(s) on the first day of school.

Grade 4 into 5

A MINIMUM of eight books is required. Book choices should be of an appropriate level.

Students need to turn in a typed list of all books they read over the summer on the first day of school.

Grade 5 into 6

A. Required <u>Weedflower</u> - Cynthia Kadohata

B. Plus One of these: Mrs. Frisby and the Rats of NIMH ~ Robert O'Brien

<u>The Crossover</u> - Kwame Alexander

C. Students must select at least <u>three</u> additional books of their own choice and complete the writing assignments.

Grade 6 into 7

A. Required Read at least 740 pages in books of your own choice. One must be a work of nonfiction. Bring a typed list of your summer reading with you the first day of school. Include authors, titles, and number of pages. At least one of the chosen books should have an AR quiz, and students need to take the test before the start of school.

Grade 7 into 8

Required for History Annie, Between the States - L. M. Elliott

The summer reading requirement for English is to read at least 750 pages of the student's choice. This might be 3 books of approximately 250 pages or two longer books. At least one of the chosen books should have an AR test, and students need to take the test before the start of school.

Summer Math - Grades 1 - 8

Just as it is important for children to continue reading during the summer, it is also important for them to continue practicing mathematics. Please refer to this list for some games, puzzles, and other challenges that we hope your children will find interesting and fun. Please encourage them to practice these throughout the summer to keep their math skills sharp and to help them get ready for next year!

Rising 1st & 2nd:

Games & Puzzles: Blokus, Castle Logix, Hi Ho! Cherry-O, Mental Blox, Chutes and Ladders, Uno.

Reference Books: *Crazy Eights and Other Card Games* by JoAnna Cole (directions for games that can be played with a deck of regular cards), *Pretend Soup* by Mollie Katzen (age-appropriate cookbook)

Rising 3rd ~5th

Games & Puzzles: those listed above as well as: Backgammon, Black Jack, Chess, Farkle, Ken-Ken, Sudoku, Yahtzee.

Around the House: use recipes to cook, make change with US coins, measure items using metric and US tools, read analogue clocks, practice multiplication combinations.
