6. Yearbooks will be distributed after Memorial Day.

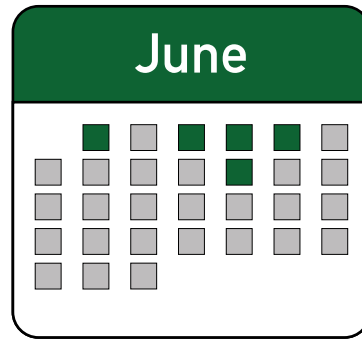
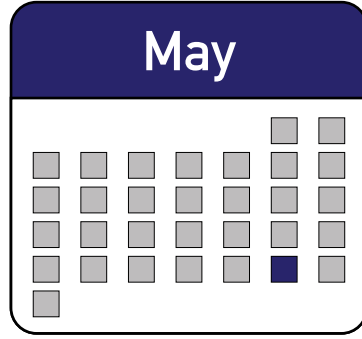

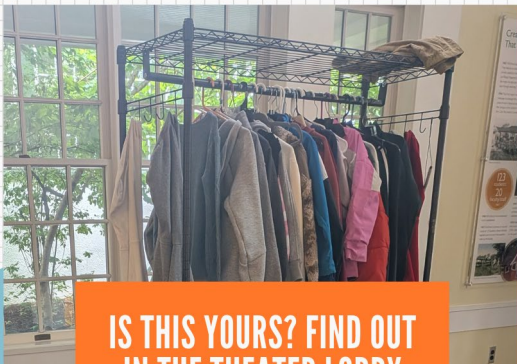
We are almost to the end of the 2025-2026 school year!

It is time to think about what books you may want to borrow for the summer. It is also time to look for those last few library books and return them before the year comes to a close. Please be aware:

- We are no longer issuing permission forms for students to borrow books over the summer. It will be assumed that if a student checks out a book over the summer they will return it either over the summer or within the first few days of school.
- All lost or damaged books will be charged to your account.
- Last day for students to borrow books during the school year is **May 15th**. (With the exception of books that are needed for classroom-only use, must stay on campus.)
- All books borrowed for the school year are due back no later than **Friday, May 29th**. We will consider all school year books that are not returned by May 29th as lost, and they will be charged to the family's account.
- For returning students only: books borrowed during summer are limited to five (5) at a time starting **May 25th**, as long as you have returned all of your school year books. If you finish the books you may return them and come back for more, up to five books.
- ***SUPER IMPORTANT!!!***** To check out books, we need the **GREEN OR WHITE CHECKOUT CARDS** in the books left with us in the library. Please be certain that the student's first name, last initial and their grade is listed on the card. The date can be blank. (See the back/other page of the flyer for checkout instructions.)
- The library is accessible over the summer **Mon-Fri 9am-4pm**. If you have questions about borrowing books and the librarian is not present, please check in with the front office or contact Kelly Johnson.
- Summer books must be returned no later than **September 18th**. Books not returned or that are returned damaged will be charged to the family's account.

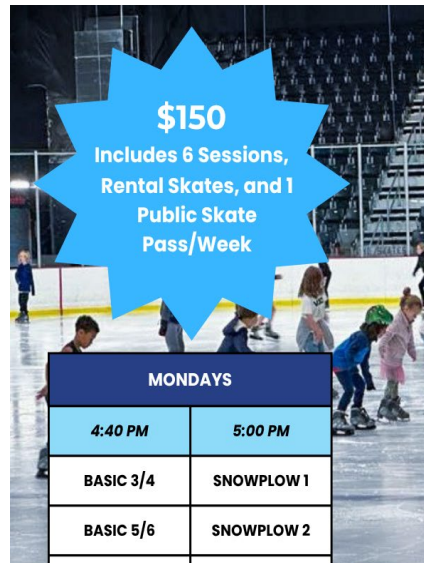


Join us on June 11th for Coffee with a Cop!
